

Statues of The Order of Teanehameha I.

Article I.

An executive Council of the Order, composed of five Members, appointed by H. M. The King, and presided over by Him, shall regulate all matters of detail pertaining to the Order.

Article II.

The commissions issued to the Members of the Order shall be signed by H. M. The King, and countersigned by the Chancellor of the Order.

Article III.

All Members residing in the Kingdom shall, on the receipt of their commissions take at the hands of the Chancellor of the Order, or at the hands of such Member as His Majesty may commission to this effect, the following oath:

I do hereby solemnly swear to remain faithful to the principle of Honor, obedient to the rules of the Order of Teanehameha I. and to be a true and faithful Knight of the said order of which I am this day made a member

Article IV.

The number of the Members shall be limited as follows:

Article V.

The Members of the Order shall on the receipt of their Commissions pay into the hands of the Treasurer of the Order the following fees of admittance;

H. Grand Crosses \$ 250 ..

, Commanders , 150 ..

, Companions , 75 ..

The above fee will include the cost of the insignia of the respective Classes.

Article VI.

In case of Promotion, the difference between the admittance fee of each Class will alone be paid into the hands of the Treasurer, and the Member promoted shall return to the Chancellor the insignia previously received by them, and shall receive the insignia of their new class.

Article VII.

H. M. The King may in Council of the Order, remit part or the whole of the fee, whenever in His Opinion circumstances may make it expedient.

Article VIII.

No admittance fee shall be claimed from foreigners, upon whom it may please His Majesty to confer the Order for important services rendered to His Majesty and People.

Article IX.

The Treasurer of the Order shall be appointed by H. M. The King, and out of the funds by him received shall defray all the necessary expenses of the Order, and report to His Majesty from time to time at meetings of the Council of the Order.

Article X.

A general Council, by meeting of all the members of the Order present in the Kingdom shall take place on the second Wednesday of April of each year, except when, from some causes deemed sufficient by His Majesty The King, it may become necessary to defer such meetings, and of such postponement, the Chancellor of the Order shall give written notice to each member.

Article XI

The Grand Council provided for in Art. X shall be the only Council at which any member shall be tried for conduct unworthy of a Knight of the Order, and this said Grand Council, shall have full authority to depose any member who in the opinion of the majority of the Council shall have been guilty of any such conduct.

Article XII

Every member shall have a full to cause to be assigned before the Grand Council any fellow-member for unworthy conduct, but he shall give due notice to the Chancellor of his intentions to do so, specifying in writing the charges, a copy of which ^{shall} shall be furnished to the member as to be accused, at least 30 days previous to the meeting at which he shall be called upon to answer.

Article XIII

Extraordinary Meetings of the Grand Council shall be convened at any time whenever the Executive Council shall deem that the interests of the Order require it, of which due notice shall be given 15 days previously by the Chancellor.

Article XIV

Any Member resident in the Kingdom, who, when notified, as per Art. X and XIII shall not attend the Grand Council, shall pay a fine of \$20.00 to the Treasurer, unless he shall by letter set forth a good cause for non attendance or subsequently to any meeting of the Grand Council assign to the Executive Council a sufficient reason for having failed to attend, and the Executive shall have power to remit the fine.

Article XV

His Majesty The King in Executive Council will make any and all appointments to any degree in the Order.

Article XVI

Whereas the IV Article sets forth the number which may be appointed to each degree of the Order, the said

Article is hereafter to be construed and understood as follows. The appointments heretofore made, or hereafter to be made for Foreign Exchange or as Complimentary to Foreign Sovereigns, or Powers, shall not be considered or reckoned as among such numbers, His Majesty The King reserving to Himself the right to make the number of appointments as in the IX article set forth exclusive of those which may be given for the reasons of State as in this article set forth.

— Article XVII —

No alterations in the Statutes of the order will be made, except the same be recommended by His Majesty's Executive Council in a meeting duly summoned as in the preceding article set forth

— Article XVIII —

The initials which are proper to be used to make evident the grade of any gentleman in the order are as follows.
